# MINUTES REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

#### MAY 28, 2018 8:00 p.m.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Council of Montreal West held on May 28, 2018 at the Town Hall located at 50 Westminster Avenue South.

Fourteen (14) residents and visitors were in attendance.

## 1. Opening of the Meeting

It was moved by Councillor Maria Torres, seconded by Councillor Dino Mazzone and resolved:

That the Meeting be declared open.

The Mayor called the Meeting to order at 8:05 p.m.

## 2. Acknowledgement of Visitors

Mayor Masella greeted and welcomed Lieutenant Fred Jennings from the Montréal Police Department (Neighbourhood Police Station 9).

## 6. Report of the Mayor

Mayor Masella noted that he has been elected on the Executive Committee of the Union des Municipalités du Québec, and explained how this organization plays an important role in the municipal world. He noted that Premier Couillard promised the province would transfer the equivalent of 1% on the Taxe du Vente du Québec to municipalities, and the other two main political parties have endorsed this commitment. The Mayor expressed his gratitude to the Montreal Police Department, whose agents have been following up more closely on dangerous behaviour at the cross level, and to the road controllers of the Société d'Assurance Automobile du Québec, who have been enforcing traffic restrictions on trucks using Avon Road. He noted the police took note of the Town's concerns following a knife fight that took place at the corner of Northview and Westminster. Finally, he said that the next Coffee with the Mayor will be June 21.

## 7. First Public Question Period

The Mayor announced the beginning of the First Public Question Period at 8:10 p.m.

Residents were invited to ask the Mayor and Councillors questions concerning matters of general interest.

John Marrett complained about the use of leaf blowers in Montreal West. The Mayor said they have been banned since 2009 except for two weeks in the spring and one month in the fall every year. He told the resident to call the Public Security Officers (PSO) if he notes that this prohibition is not respected.

Norbert Bedoucha pointed out the impact of vibrations generated by the work on the Turcot exchange project, and more particularly damages to the building of a business on Ronald, Adore Croissants, and he handed pictures. The Mayor said he was not aware of this situation. Councillor Mazzone noted that the Town cannot be responsible for something due to the consequences of the work done by a contractor which the Ministry of Transports of Quebec (MTQ) selected. The Mayor added that the neighborhood committee headed by the MTQ would be the proper forum to send this information in order to get a response. As the resident said the owner of that building sent a letter to Council, the Mayor answered he was surprised since the owner was previously his neighbor and would know how to reach him.

Philippe Bergeron asked what are Council's intentions regarding R.D. Paul Park. Councillor Ulin said the Town will look at the results of the survey that was made and come up with a plan based on the residents' interests. She noted that there are some restraints, however, like underground pipes in this area. The resident noted that security is a concern to be taken into account.

Louise Chenevert asked if the list of permits which is produced monthly could include tree cutting permits, with other information like the species, for instance. Mayor Masella said it could be discussed. Councillor Feeney remarked that these permits are issued by the Building Inspector in accordance with Town by-laws, which are very strict.

Suzanne Barwick mentioned that Mr. Peter Cooney thanked Council for having helped with the action taken regarding trucks on Avon Road.

Dimitri Prassinos asked when there will be speed bumps on his corner of Ballantyne North. The Mayor answered that there will not be any such work before traffic speed studies have been conducted, which has not been done yet but should be this year. The resident also deplored the lack of adequate landscape maintenance of a particular building. The Mayor said he would look into that.

Cynthia Nichols spoke of a plate to be placed beside the peace tree planted in 2015 at St. Philip's Church. The Mayor said the Church could put it anywhere on its property. The resident wondered why she was not invited at the Community Night celebration. She was told at the Recreation and Culture Department it was because she did not represent an organization, but disagreed with that assessment. She said her peace garden project involved various people. Councillor Ulin explained that this event targeted Montreal West organizations like the volunteers at the library or the scouts and guides, not individual volunteer work or business projects or initiatives.

The First Question Period ended at 8:35 p.m.

## 8. Contracts and Town Clerk's Office

a) <u>Inter-municipal agreement concerning a mandate to the Union des municipalités du Québec (UMQ) for the purchase of property and liability insurance and the hiring of a consultant and risk manager</u>

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 29.9.1 of the Cities and Towns Act (CQLR c. C-19), a municipality may enter into an agreement with Union des municipalités du Québec (UMQ) to award an insurance contract or a contract for the supply of services;

WHEREAS, in 2014, the Town entered into an agreement with other municipalities of the island of Montreal to form a purchasing group called "Regroupement municipalités de l'Île de Montréal relativement à l'achat en commun d'assurances de dommages et de services de consultant et de gestionnaire de risques", and said agreement expires on January 1, 2019;

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to enter into a new agreement with the municipalities which are members of this purchasing group for a five (5) year period, from January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2023:

#### THEREFORE:

It was moved by Councillor Elizabeth Ulin, seconded by Councillor Colleen Feeney and resolved:

- 1) That the Town agree to take part in the "Regroupement municipalités de l'Île de Montréal relativement à l'achat en commun d'assurances de dommages et de services de consultant et de gestionnaire de risques".
- 2) That Council designate the UMQ to act as its mandatary in order to make a common call for tenders and award a contract on behalf of the Town for the purchase of general liability insurance and to obtain consultant services in general insurance risk management.
- 3) That the Mayor and the Town Clerk be authorized to sign on behalf of the Town, the agreement entitled "Entente du Regroupement municipalités de l'Île de Montréal relativement à l'achat en commun d'assurances de dommages et de services de consultant et de gestionnaire de risques 2019-2023".

Harold Knowles asked about the goal of joining the UMQ to purchase insurance with other municipalities. The Mayor answered this is the way it has been done ever since the demerger, through inter-municipal agreements which are renewed every five years. The resident wondered if it was really to the advantage of Montreal West. Having been invited by the Mayor to comment, the Town Clerk mentioned that even though the goal is to get better prices by increasing the pool for insurers, the policies are set to the individual characteristics of member municipalities, like different amounts for deductibles and premiums adjusted on claim experience.

Cynthia Nichols asked a question about the new Seniors Committee. Councillor Feeney summed up how it would work. The resident also asked how she could have her project recognized as community organization. Councillor Ulin said she would see with the Recreation and Culture Department.
