

## Urban agglomeration 2020-2025 master plan for residual materials management

The Commission permanente sur l'eau, l'environnement, le développement durable et les grands parcs invites Montrealers to take part in a public consultation on the "Projet de Plan directeur de gestion des matières résiduelles de l'agglomération montréalaise 2020-2025".

Interested parties will be able to express their views on the vision, goals, focus areas and guiding principles in the draft plan, which map the way for Montréal to become a zero waste metropolis by 2030. The 2020-2025 master plan is intended to serve as a lever, building on past efforts, while implementing bold and concrete actions to support the city's commitment to an ecological transition.

The consultation will be held in three parts. The first part will consist of an information session, where the issue will be presented and people will be invited to ask questions. The second part will be devoted to the hearing of briefs and opinions. During the third part, the commission will adopt its recommendations.
