# 6. Report of the Mayor

Mayor Masella reported that he met with the senior directors of the Montreal Police Department at the end of last month, where he was informed of an up-coming merger of Neighborhood Police Station PDQ 9 in Côte Saint-Luc with PDQ 11 in Notre-Dame-de-Grace. The new merged station would remain in the current location of PDQ 9 on Westminster at Côte Saint-Luc Road. The Mayor was told that there would be no decrease in the number of police officers with the combined station. Although he could see some advantages with increased workforce, access to undercover units and greater presence, he noted that other mayors have raised some issues. The senior officers have now invited the elected officials of Montreal West, Côte Saint-Luc, Hampstead and Notre-Dame-de-Grace to an information session. Finally, he said that the next Coffee with the Mayor will be Thursday, March 26, from 7:30 to 8:30 a.m. in the Community Centre.

 Normalize the combined lateral setback of the main building which is 3.17 metres instead of the minimum 4 metres required in that zone, the consequence being to reduce this requirement by 0.83 metre.

 Normalize the encroachment of an existing deck in the front setback, despite the fact that such an encroachment is not allowed, the consequence being to allow that the deck be located at 2.72 metres from the property line instead of a minimum of 4.57 metres as for the main building, thereby reducing the requirement by 1.85 metres.

Kadeja Lefebvre commented the incident reported by Councillor Mazzone in his report that occurred on Fielding due to speeding. She did not believe that a barrier would be enough to avoid more incidents of that sort. Councillor Mazzone answered that to his knowledge, too many drivers disrespect rules too often. The Town does not have a real solution so we try to raise the level of conversation.

Cynthia Nichols complained about the level of service she said she does not receive from the Town, be it for the collection of her waste or the safety of her home. She said she had reported an incident to the police. Councillor Mazzone answered that it was not mentioned in the monthly report he gets from Neighborhood Station 9.

Michael Shinder wanted to know the background for the change to the urban plan. Mayor Masella explained that it is to put the urban plan in line with the zoning by-law in a sector located at the end of Brock South, which allows lower density projects. This is why the zoning by-law will not have to be amended as a result.
