5. Correspondence

There was nothing under this item.

6. Report of the Mayor

Mayor Masella noted that even with the announcement that a vaccine will be available in a not too distant feature, holiday celebrations will not be the same this year because the restrictions put forward by public health authorities will limit the usual family and friendly gatherings. He invited his listeners not to lose heart despite this situation. Above all, he urged them not to give up on following safety guidelines at this time. The Mayor also thanked municipal employees on behalf of Council for their dedication to keep things as normal as possible in the present circumstances. Finally, he extended his holiday season's wishes to all residents and hopes for a happy new year.

7. First Public Question Period

The Mayor announced the beginning of the First Public Question Period at 8:15 p.m.

Given the circumstances, residents had been invited to submit in advance their questions concerning matters of general interest to the Mayor and Councillors.

1. Nancy Mackey

Asked the reason why the contractor has changed for the garbage collection service.

2. Sarah Carev

Concerning the redevelopment of the library's current site, asked what will be the schedule for ground breaking and construction be like. Also asked what businesses are being considered and if the public will have a say.

Susvn Borer

Asked what is happening at the old and unused Bank of Montreal building, as there seems to be lots of work going on inside.

4. Ann McLaughlin

Raised the problem of rats and other vermin around Westminster businesses and on Strathearn once again. Also asked why the Town does not require businesses to use secure waste-disposal containers.

5. Christopher Smith

Asked when more public information will be available with regards to the schedule of ground-breaking and construction of new Easton condominiums being developed at the corner of Westminster and Avon. Also asked what businesses will be permitted and if residents will have a voice in their selection.

6. Harold Knowles

Said The Gazette has reported that Beaconsfield Mayor Georges Bourelle contends that his municipality has overpaid by \$2 million to the City of Montreal and has retained a lawyer to pursue the issue. Asked if there has been any progress in getting a fairer arrangement with the City of Montreal and the demerged municipalities recently.

7. Stan Carnyo

Said that the new street lights cast less light making his street less safe. With only two for the whole street, it needs more. Asked the Town to put in more lights or go back to the previous system, and noted that others share his views.

8. Stephen Donahue

Asked why the Town cannot clear the sidewalks (walking path) across the track after snow storms.

9. Stan Carny

Concerning winter car shelters, an issue which he raised before, asked Council to provide facts and data in order to justify its position, and if it would agree to hold a referendum on the question.

10. Peter McLean

Asked if anybody has come up with a solution for the bicycles on sidewalks, and if a garbage can is going to be put beside the bus stop at Nelson and Westminster.

11. J.J. Heisler

Asked if and when skating rinks will be completed in light of the current Covid-19 situation.

9. Administration and finances

a) Approval of disbursements - November 27 to December 9, 2020

b) Subsidy application - gas excise tax

WHEREAS the Town has taken cognizance of the Guide concerning the Payment Terms of the Government's Contribution within the scope of the Program regarding Gasoline Tax and the Contribution of Quebec (TECQ) for the years 2019 to 2023;

WHEREAS the Town must follow the applicable terms of this Guide in order to receive a contribution in the amount of \$ 1,974,983, as confirmed by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, for the carrying out of sewer and aqueduct lines renewal work (priority 3);

THEREFORE:

It was moved by Councillor Maria Torres, seconded by Councillor Colleen Feeney and resolved:

- 1) That the Town of Montreal West undertake to comply with the applicable content of the Guide mentioned in the preamble.
- 2) That the Town accept and agree to be fully and solely liable and to exonerate the Canadian and Quebec Governments as well as their ministers, officers, employees and agents in the event of any claims, requests, losses, damages and costs of whatever nature arising from bodily injuries to third parties (including death) and material losses or damages to property that may be attributed to a deliberate or negligent behavior directly or indirectly linked to capital expenditures realized with the proceeds from the funding received under the TECQ 2019-2023 program.
- 3) That the Town approve and authorize the sending of the partial work planning enclosed with this resolution (file number 1166047 version number 1) and of all the required documentation to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, in order to receive the contribution of which it was notified, as mentioned in the preamble.
- 4) That the Town undertake to reach the minimum level of investment in terms of municipal infrastructure, that is, to spend at least \$50 / person / year during each one of the five years of the program, meaning a total of \$250 per person.
- 5) That the Town undertake to inform the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing of any modification that may be brought to the said work planning approved by the present resolution.

b) Minor exemption request - 457 Westminster North

That the plans and request submitted to the November 11, 2020 meeting of the Planning Advisory Committee be approved, in accordance with By-Laws 2020-002 and G-18-0005, for the following minor exemptions from the schedule of uses and standards in effect under section 3.2.2 of the Zoning By-Law, regarding the immovable located at 457 Westminster North in zone RA-1 to:

 Normalize a lateral setback on the South-East side of the main building which is of 0.21 metre, while the minimum setback is 1.20 metres in that zone, the consequence being to reduce this requirement by 0.99 metre.

a) <u>Ecological transition support services – CMTL partnership</u>

WHEREAS the Town of Montreal West intends to adopt a comprehensive waste management policy in the near future;

WHEREAS there is a partnership between the Agglomeration of Montréal and Concertation Montréal (CMTL);

WHEREAS CMTL has a developed an expertise in the field of ecological transition, especially with its programme L'Accélérateur;

WHEREAS CMTL submitted a service offer to provide the Town of Montreal West with coaching on matters of ecological transition;

WHEREAS

It was moved by Councillor Elizabeth Ulin, seconded by Councillor Maria Torres and resolved:

- 1) To accept the service offer of CMTL for ecological transition support services.
- 2) To authorize the Director General to sign any necessary documents to implement this resolution.

b) <u>Traceability analysis of construction, renovation and demolition (CRD) waste – Mitacs partnership</u>

WHEREAS the Town of Montreal West intends to adopt a comprehensive waste management policy in the near future;

WHEREAS the Town has no traceability data on CRD waste in Montreal West;

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to realize a picture of the situation in order to follow up the transit of CRD waste and evaluate if it ends up where it should and if there can be market outlets in the circular economy;

WHEREAS Mitacs is a non-profit organization promoting research and development by linking municipalities and industries with post-secondary learning institutions in order to solve innovation issues in Canada and abroad;

WHEREAS Mitacs proposes to pair the Town with Professor Chunjiang An from Concordia University to produce a study concerning the management of CRD waste in Montreal West;

WHEREAS Mitacs undertakes to contribute an amount of \$7500 plus taxes to fund a portion of the costs for this study;

THEREFORE:

It was moved by Councillor Dino Mazzone, seconded by Councillor Colleen Feeney and resolved:

- 1) That the Town undertake to carry out the project called ACCÉLÉRATION and to use the contribution of \$7500 plus taxes in accordance with the schedule of payments of the Mitacs Accélération programme.
- 2) That the Director General be authorized to sign any necessary documents to implement this resolution.
