PUBLIC NOTICE ELECTION OF NOVEMBER 7, 2021 REVISION OF MUNICIPAL LIST OF ELECTORS

TO THE ELECTORS OF THE TOWN OF MONTREAL WEST

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given by the undersigned Returning Officer, that:

- 1. The list of electors has been filed with the Returning Officer on October 4, 2021 and will be revised starting on October 13, 2021.
- 2. To be an elector and to qualify for entry on the municipal list of electors, every person of legal age on November 7, 2021 must, on September 1, 2021:
 - be a Canadian citizen;
 - not be under curatorship;
 - not have been convicted of an offence that is a corrupt electoral practice; and

meet one of the following conditions:

- be domiciled within the territory of the municipality on September 1, 2021 and in Quebec since at least 6 months; or
- since at least September 1, 2020:
 - have **owned an immovable** in the territory of the municipality and have filed a written application for entry on the list of electors with the Returning Officer; **or**
 - have **occupied a business establishment** in the territory of the municipality and have filed a written application for entry on the list of electors with the Returning Officer.

NOTE: the sole owner of several immovables or the sole occupant of several business establishments must register at the address of the immovable or business establishment having the highest property or rental value, as the case may be.

Where an immovable belongs to undivided co-owners or where a business establishment is occupied by co-occupants, no person other than the undivided co-owner or co-occupant designated under a power of attorney signed by the majority of co-owners or co-occupants, who are electors on September 1, 2021, may be entered on the list of electors as owner of the immovable or occupant of the business establishment. The power of attorney must be submitted to the Returning Officer.

Despite the foregoing, a person who is an elector in more than one capacity may only be entered on the list of electors in one capacity in the following order of preference:

- 1. as a domiciled person
- 2. as the sole owner of an immovable
- 3. as the sole occupant of a business establishment
- 4. as an undivided co-owner of an immovable
- 5. as a co-occupant of a business establishment
- 3. Where an application for entry of a domiciled person on the territory of the municipality is filed, the person who files the application must specify the former address of the domicile of the person concerned and submit two documents: one bearing the name and date of birth of the person concerned, and the other, the name and the address of the domicile of the person concerned.

4. The list of electors may be consulted and applications for entry, striking off or correction must be filed at the office of the Board of Revision located at the following address:

5. A written application for entry, correction or striking from the list of electors may be submitted to the returning officer by one who is domiciled in the municipality and is in one of the following situations

- Unable to travel for health reasons or you are a caregiver domiciled at the same address as such a person.
- 70 years of age or older on polling day.
- Bound to comply with an order or recommendation for isolation from public health authorities because:
 - returned from a trip abroad within the last 14 days;
 - were diagnosed with COVID-19 and you are still considered a carrier of the disease;
 - are showing COVID-19 symptoms;
 - have been in contact with a suspected, probable or confirmed case of COVID-19 within the last 14 days;
 - are waiting for a COVID-19 test result.

This application must be accompanied by a copy of two documents: one showing the applicant's name and date of birth and the other showing his/her name and domiciliary address.

To obtain the required forms, contact the returning officer. He must then have received them no later than Monday, October 18 at 5:30 p.m..

6. A person who is in one of the above-described situations, and who is entered on the list of electors, can also vote by mail. To do this, one must make a verbal or written request to the returning officer no later than October 27, 2021.

If the request to vote by mail is due to the fact that the person must comply with an order or a recommendation from public health authorities to isolate, such a request can only be made from October 17, 2021 and will be valid for the current poll only. If the person making that request is one of the other situations described above, the application will be valid for the current poll and any recommenced proceedings arising from this election.
