Interventions prior to work on the
water supply system

Important to know

**Possible impacts on
your tap water**

- Yellowish, brownish or reddish colour. **See reverse for instructions before consuming water.**
- Water discolouration may occur at various times and does not usually last very long.
- If it persists beyond the above-mentioned period, call 311.

**What does this work
involve?**

- Flushing a pipe by manipulating valves and opening fire hydrants.

Location of the interventions

- On Chemin Westover, between Avenue Sunnybrooke and Westminster.
- Throughout cities of Côte-Saint-Luc and Montreal West.

Traffic

- Restricted and short-term obstructions only.

Access to buildings

- Pedestrian access to the buildings around the work site will be maintained at all times. Sidewalks may be obstructed during some phases.

Work schedule

- Wednesday, June 15, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

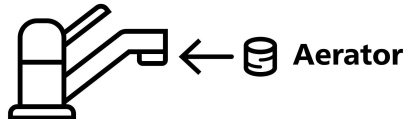
Steps to follow if your water is discoloured

Turn on your cold water tap.

- Preferably the bathtub tap, otherwise the kitchen sink tap. If your property has neither a bathtub nor a kitchen sink (because it is a shop, for example), use whatever tap you have available.
- Let the cold water run until it becomes clear again.
- Your tap water can then be consumed.

Does your tap have an aerator?

- Before letting the water run, it is recommended to unscrew the nozzle to remove it.



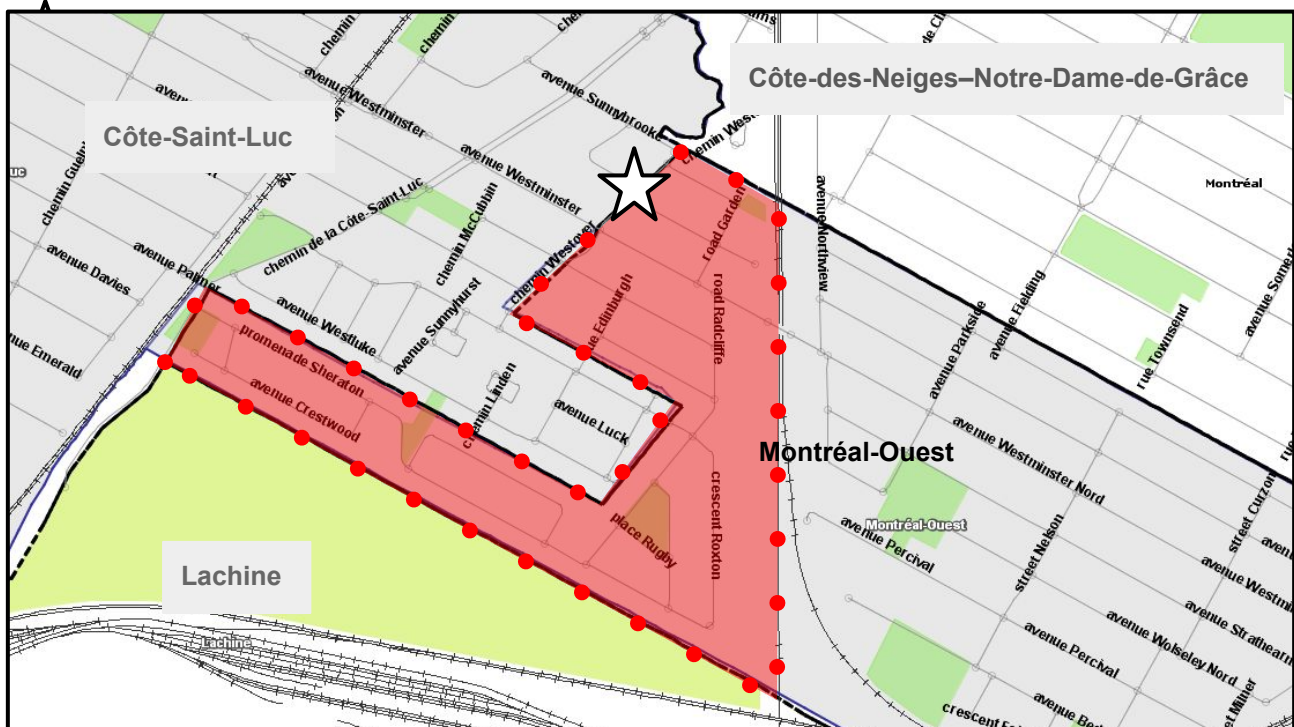
Important

- To avoid staining fabrics or damaging your appliances, make sure the water is clear before doing your laundry or using an appliance that uses water.
